Grief and joy simultaneously fill those whose memory knows how to be grateful. Every generation born after the Victory is deeply indebted to the veterans of the great Patriotic war.

I want to tell you about Plaksina Sofya Vasilyevna, my great-grandmother's own sister on my mother's side.

Sofia Plaksina was born on April 24 1924 in the village of Shchukino The Sarajevo of the village Council. At present, only the ruined Sergius Church and the remains of the cemetery next to the Church remain of the village.

After graduating from the age of seven, in September 1939, Sofia entered the courses of nurses in the city of Furmanov, and completed the full courseof the school of "Nurses" in 1941.

During the great Patriotic war, she worked in the Evacuation hospital No. 3440 from February 10, 1942 to September 7, 1945goda. The hospital with this number was first located in Furmanov from 23.01.1942 to 28.08.1943.

The history of our Motherland teaches that in all wars the Russian woman showed examples of heroism, selflessness and contempt for death. The work of the nurse in the hospital very important. The nurse takes an active part in the treatment of patients, butas a rule, she does not treat them independently, but on doctor's orders and under his supervision. To perform well the duties of a nurse in an emergency hospital, it is not enough to make a dressing, you need to arrange the injured person well ,raise his spirit and mood. A nurse must accurately and accurately carry out all the doctor's prescriptions and instructions, but this is far from limited to her functions.

Here is Sofia Vasilyevna, was not just a nurse, but an instructor in physical therapy. While working at the hospital, she developed training programs, and then selected sets of exercises for hygienic and therapeutic gymnastics. In the beginning, Sofya Vasilyevna led conversations with patients about the benefits of physical exercise treatment, and only after that she went directly to classes.

The wounded loved her for her warmth and affection. She constantly participated in Amateur performances. Her photo has graced the hospital's honor Roll more than once.

In 1944, Sophia met her future husband, Vasily. Butunfortunately, he did not live to see Victory Day. And on August 8, 1945, Sofya Vasilyevna gave birth to a son –Vyakeslav Vasilyevich.

The war ended, but Plaksina Sofya Vasilyevna did not return home immediately, and she continued her service in the evacuation hospital No. 3440 until September, 1905.

In peacetime, remaining devoted to medicine, she worked for many years as an instructor in physical therapy in hospitals in the city of Ivanovo. The conscientious work of Sofya Vasilyevna was repeatedly awarded with awards.
